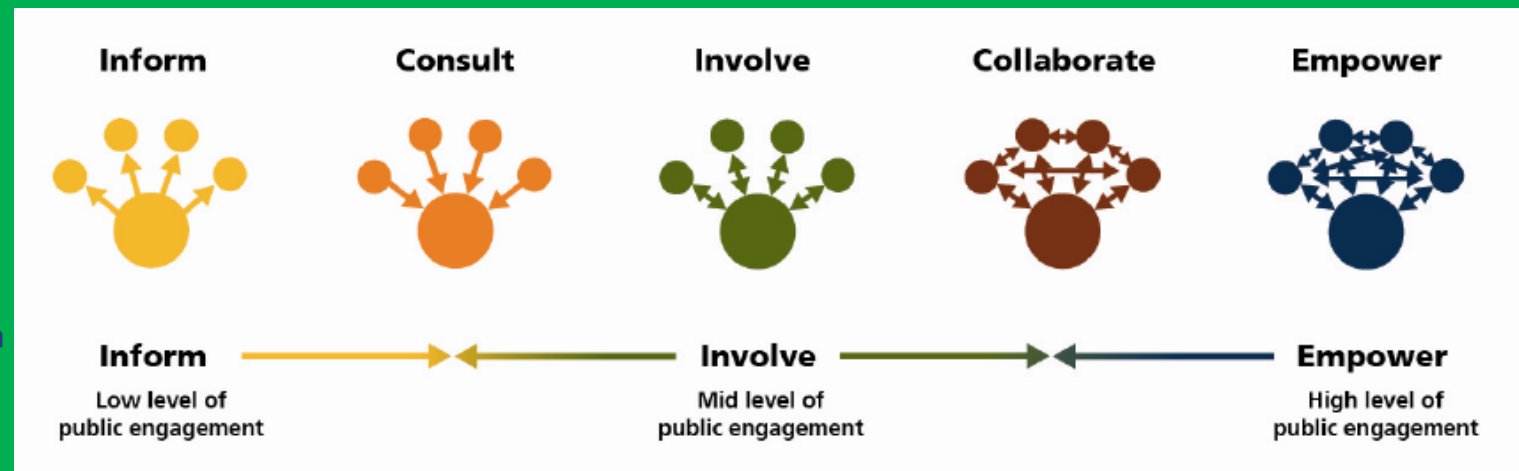

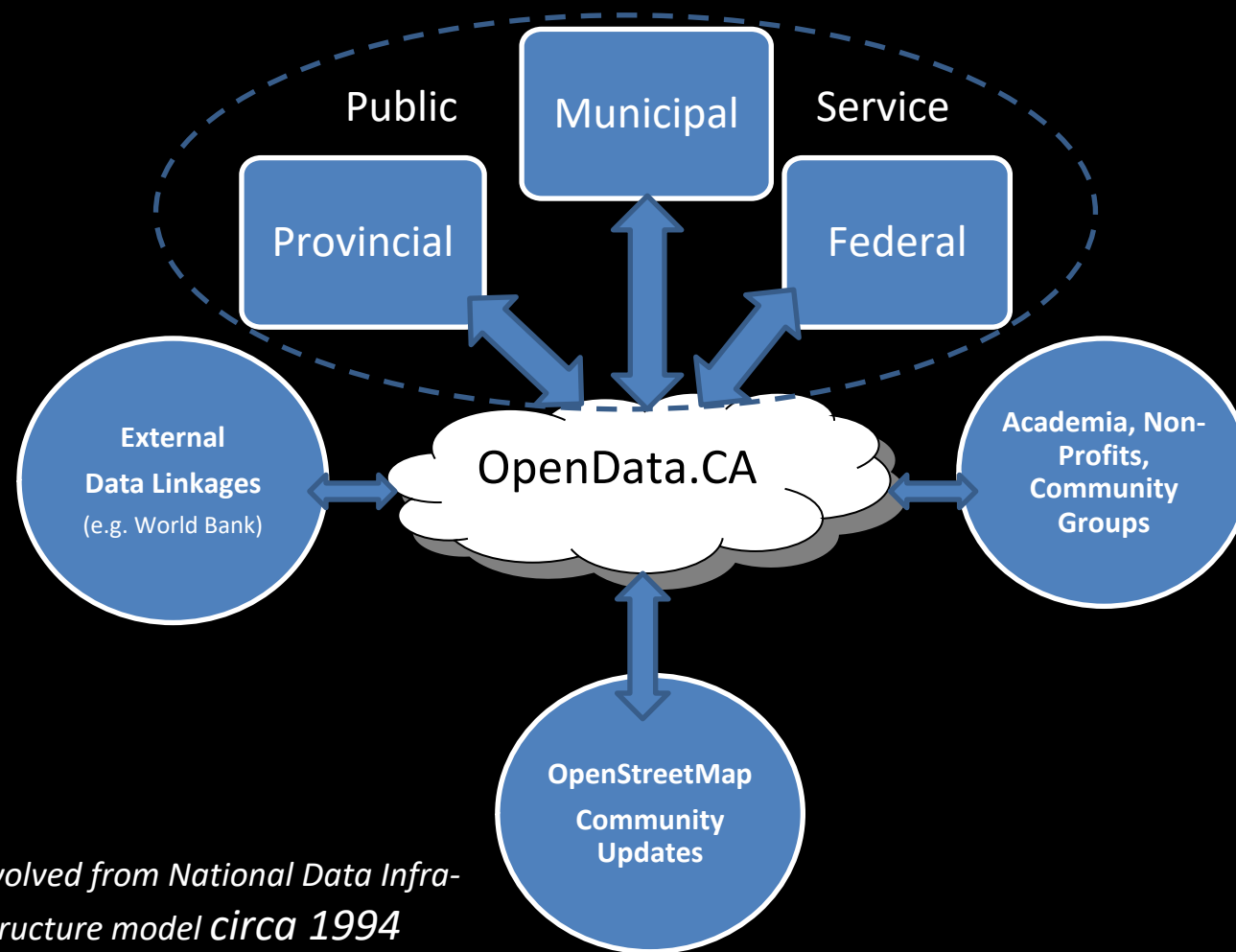


Open by Design
