# Living in Niagara (LIN) report: a regular snapshot of quality of life in the Niagara-wide community

- LIN Sectors align with the Social Determinants of Health
  - Report weaves together Niagara-focused socio-economic evidence, to reflect how people live in our community
- Sector data & information + front-line community expert opinion
  - Draws evidence-informed picture of life in Niagara now
  - Points to what is emerging
  - Identifies suggested community action to address issues of common concern









# Living in Niagara (LIN) report: a regular snapshot of quality of life in the Niagara-wide community

Evidence presented in the LIN report is used by people, organizations, institutions, researchers, educators and businesses to:

- Inform priority-setting
- Secure funding (evidence to make a business case)
- Support partnerships
- Learn about what's emerging in the Niagara context (fast-track environmental scan)









# February, 2022 Living in Niagara and Niagara Knowledge Exchange Use and Impact Survey – preliminary insights

People are utilizing evidence accessed through the Living in Niagara report and Niagara Knowledge Exchange to:

- Be aware of community trends, information, demographics, data
- Inform strategic planning, business planning, program planning
- Access evidence to support grant proposals
- Support education, research
- Share evidence with community partners and to support partnerships









# Living in Niagara-2020 report: Overall Opportunities Suggested for Action

- 1. Equity Links to Prosperity
- 2. Digital Skills and Access to Technology are Essential
- 3. Growth Balanced with Inclusion
- 4. Community-Building is Essential (to stabilize, post-pandemic)
- 5. Connectedness, Social Inclusion are Cornerstones of Well-Being









## Living in Niagara-2020 report: Overall Opportunities Suggested for Action (cont'd)

- 6. Feelings of Loss are Common (uncertainty, connections, milestones)
- 7. What's Emerging, and its Impact (develop Niagara-focused, community-driven, validated methodology to guide decision-making)
- 8. Opportunities Arising from the Pandemic Experience (lessons learned)
- 9. Celebrate Niagara's Strengths (create conditions for hard-hit businesses to stabilize)
- 10. Mental Wellness for All Ages (imperative forefront priority)

  - 211 Resource Data










### **211 Community Data**

#### 211 Contact Data

- Reflected in Living in Niagara-2020 report
- Includes number of inquiries, needs & unmet needs
- Non-public can include deeper data (i.e. postal code data-first 3 digits)
- Approximately 85% of contacts tracked
- Now self search on <u>Public User Needs</u>
   Dashboard



## 211 Community Data 211 Resource Data

- Data curated & maintained at the local level of community and social services
- May be shared with interested community partners, to create unique data views
- Recently used with API

   (application
   programming interface)
   technology to build Older
   Adult Infolink, launched
   in December, 2021
