


Federal Election Voter Turnout in NIAGARA 2004-2011



How many voted in 2011?

In the four elections between 2004 and 2011, Niagara Region had four federal ridings: Niagara Falls, Niagara West-Glanbrook, St. Catharines, and Welland. Residents of Glanbrook live outside the Niagara Region, but are included in these numbers.

This changes in 2015 due to redistribution when the four ridings will be exclusive to Niagara residents. The new ridings are Niagara Falls, Niagara Centre, Niagara West and St. Catharines.





