Our commitment to you: We work to ensure that your generous gift is carefully invested into quality programming, creating the opportunity for a better life for everyone in our region, today, tomorrow and into the future.

Where your money goes: 34% From Poverty to Possibility: Investing in programs that meet basic human needs and move people out of poverty. 28% Strong Communities: Investing in programs that create safe and inclusive communities with vulnerable adults. 38% All That Kids Can Be: Investing in programs that encourage children and youth to reach their full potential.

The Process: United Way raises funds through workplace campaigns, community donors, corporate donations, labour partners, special events and grants. A panel of community volunteers reviews funding applications and meets with agencies to learn more about the programs they offer. After reviewing all requests, volunteers recommend how available funds should be allocated and report to United Way's Board of Directors for approval. Finally, donations are invested into local programs and services, benefitting families, children and individuals in need.



GOAL: To create safe and inclusive communities for vulnerable adults.



This is Barbara.

Barbara is 68 years old. She suffered a spinal injury because of a workplace accident almost ten years ago. Barbara was not able to safely get around outside her apartment. Her therapist recommended a scooter but the costs were not covered and the disability claims were denied. She decided to approach March of Dimes Assistive Devices Program for help. She was able to get a scooter.

With the power scooter, she is now able to volunteer at a museum. She has described her feeling of getting a scooter as "awesome, great and mobile, I am happy to be able to have one as I always have been an active and outgoing person. It keeps me mobile, to be out in public, and be around everything!"

26 life-changing assistive devices were provided in 2017.

My scooter helps me to enjoy freedom, to be able to get out of my apartment, and go to a grocery store just to pick up a couple of items. Without United Way, I would not have my scooter, I would be very lonely. There would be no going anywhere.

Impact: 52,276 people helped.

"Without the support of United Way we would not have been able to provide the training on how to use a Naloxone kit to temporarily reverse the effects of a drug overdose. These people are alive today thanks to this United Way supported service."




Paul is a learner, as they're called in the Literacy for Life program, supported by United Way. Paul was one of eight children who grew up in a wonderful, supportive family; he recalls literacy being important, and loved to read as a child.

"I found this to be a surprisingly positive venture. I have learned new skills and am affirming old ones. I feel I am closer to my goal than I had thought."

However, life happened...or death as it was in this case. When Paul was in the ninth grade, his father passed away, and he was forced to leave school to work in the construction industry to help support his mother and siblings. After many years of working hard, Paul suffered a workplace injury and, at age 55, now relies on Ontario Works for income.

He wants to re-enter the workforce and would like to complete his G.E.D. to secure a better job. Paul has been involved in Literacy for Life for a few months, working closely with his fabulous tutor Catherine, and his confidence has grown by leaps and bounds. Catherine has learned as much from Paul as he has from her, she says. Thanks to the rigorous training and matching, tutors like Catherine are paired with learners' like Paul in the hope that both parties will benefit from the relationship.

Impact: 30,800 people helped.



This is Ron.

Ron's story, as he tells it, began at age 15 when he took up drinking to fit in with friends. Over time he became addicted and ended up living wherever he found a place to lay his head. At one point, "home" meant seeking shelter beneath the St. Paul Street Bridge. Ron decided to get sober after 30 years of "ending up all sorts of places [he] didn't wanna be. [He] had had enough". Despite giving up alcohol, he still struggled to make ends meet until he met Kyle and Ada, staff members at Start Me Up Niagara (SMUN). Ron first met with Kyle to get himself housed and on the right track, Ada is helping him stay on that track by connecting him with important services like Canada Pension.

"My income matters because without income I have problems. I need help with the problems and I come here and get it."

Ron is a senior who lives on Old Age Security which he was able to apply for, along with other government benefits to which his is entitled. The Income Matters program at SMUN gives him the opportunity for assistance in any issues related to his income. It is a mundane chore for many, but to Ron and others like him, arranging for government benefits is not an easy task. Homeless and marginalized individuals often have no identification, no bank account and no online Canada Revenue account: essentially, no way to receive funds. The Income Matters program offers people the opportunity to drop in and get the help they need to secure income such as income tax refunds, Canada Pension Plan payments, Trillium benefits and GST rebates.

At 7:30 every morning, Ron now volunteers to come in to SMUN to put the coffee on for staff and the friends he has there. It has been a part of his daily routine for the last five years, ever since he was able to secure housing and a steady income. It is his way of giving back to an agency which has transformed his life.

108 learners went through the Literacy for Life program in 2017. **33,000** drop-in visits at SMUN this year, or 33,000 opportunities to help. **25,008** people didn't go hungry after accessing food programs.

"It's comforting to know we can come to school and have breakfast, or lunch, or snack here and there. It's a blessing to have."

"Nutritious food, friends, and caring adults are the keys to the Breakfast Program at Harriet Tubman School. Through the generous donations of several community partners, such as United Way, it is possible to provide a daily Breakfast Program for approximately 125 students in Kindergarten to Grade 8. During this time, students sit down and eat a nutritious breakfast. Positive social interactions occur as students connect with each other, form friendships and start the day with positive interactions with peers and adult volunteers. Research indicates that breakfast makes a huge impact on their day at school, energizing and jump starting their ability to learn and focus."

Impact: 12,165 children & youth helped.

Alexis started high school with her peers, but quickly became a troubled student. Her home life was volatile, eventually resulting in her leaving home and meeting her boyfriend, with whom she became deeply involved. At age 16, Alexis discovered that she was pregnant.

Alexis ultimately chose to embrace motherhood and hasn't regretted her decision for a moment.

After her son was born, she took a short break from classes until they got into a good routine and everyone was sleeping through the night. Alexis knew she wanted to finish high school, but found that she was many credits short of completion and missing all of her community volunteer hours.

When she started participating in the Young Moms Support program through Strive Niagara she was apprehensive, but soon learned to trust the staff

and accept the help she needed. Thanks to the outreach program at Strive, Alexis has been able to continue her high school education. She feels comfortable leaving her son at their Child Care Centre to go to classes, which has made the whole process much easier.

"It was the toughest time in my life with everyone sharing their opinions on whether or not I should keep the baby. It was very stressful."

Now 19, Alexis is the wonderful mother of a happy little boy with a contagious smile. She has started volunteering with Postponing Parenting 'Til You're Ready, another program at Strive, which involves traveling to high schools to share her story and teach other students the challenges of parenting at a young age. With support from both of these programs, Alexis is on track to graduate and go on to college. She has aspirations of becoming a fire fighter, a dream that is supported by her biggest advocate, her grandfather, with whom she has a wonderful relationship. She is now only seven credits away from graduating and attributes her success to the amazing support of Strive Niagara.

76 young moms worked towards their high school diploma this year thanks to the support of Strive.

Sara wakes up, rolls out of bed and pads barefoot down the cold hall to the bathroom. She flips on the light; it flickers a few times before going on. She can almost see her breathe it feels so cold in her tiny apartment. It's still dark outside but she has to be ready to walk the 40 minutes to work, and get there on time. The buses do not run this early. This is her ninth day in a row and she's exhausted but she really needs that pay check. She goes to the bathroom, oh no, it's "that time of the month" too. She reaches under the creaky sink and there's nothing there. Now what? Periods are a fact of life. For women living in poverty, there is an added challenge of acquiring monthly feminine hygiene products. For women who are experiencing homelessness, it is an even bigger challenge.

The 2ND annual Tampon Tuesday took place on March 6 at The Feathery Pub, hosted by Labour Programs & Services of United Way of St. Catharines & District in partnership with Bell Media. It was an event where union members and community members were invited to come out for a social evening of fun and learning. The price of admission was one unopened box of feminine hygiene products.

Labour Programs & Services is a partnership between United Way Centraide Canada and the Canadian Labour Congress, locally implemented by United Way of St Catharines & District and Niagara Regional Labour Council.


